The Shroud is potentially the most significant relic known to humanity. Believers and Skeptics alike will learn from the information provided.

Explore the exhibit's 66 panels detailing the Shroud's history and science. A full-length, museum-quality image—from an Eastman Kodak Co. photographic image—is the exhibit's centerpiece showing the Shroud's front and back.

The exhibit includes a large, crucified corpus showing Christ's wounds corresponding to the wounds on the life-size and the wounds shown on the Shroud.

The Shroud of Turin—*long believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth*—is the most scientifically studied and debated religious icon in history. It has inspired the faithful and skeptics for generations, and now, the “Man of the Shroud” exhibit is coming to Denton, North Carolina.
